



Happy New Year, everybody! I trust that all our members and their families have enjoyed a pleasant Christmas break.

We are now at the half-way point in our Toastmaster year, so this is a good time to take stock of our situation, but that begs the question: "How do we analyse our club's health?"

Benjamin Disraeli told us that there are "lies, damn lies and statistics", so let's be perspicacious about numbers and their use in bolstering weak arguments. While we may need his warning, we may still use data to help us reach conclusions, provided we look at the context and reasons behind the figures.

If you look at our club's progress with regard to the Distinguished Club Program alone, you would note that we have achieved two of the possible ten goals. On the surface, it would appear that we are lagging behind. Right now, we can't count the four members who are very close to achieving educational awards, so we're stuck at two.

On the other hand, figures relating to membership paint a much rosier picture.

We currently have twenty-three financial members. This number is exceeded by only two clubs in Area 20 and it is above the mean figure for the District.

The attendance of our members is also very good. By my calculations, the average attendance is sixteen. Of the total, that works out at around 70%.

Our club is right on track with new member recruitment, having gained four new members over this six-month period.

You can see that a different impression can be gained, depending on which figures are used.

For the real truth, you need to dig deeper. For example, consider why we have good membership figures.

I believe that the driving force behind these numbers is the enthusiasm of the members, and this, in turn, derives from the quality of the meetings. Everybody has a lot of fun at meetings, so they have a big incentive to keep coming back. Their enthusiasm is infectious, so guests don't require much persuasion to join.

Of course, some credit for creating this congenial atmosphere goes to the staff of Revesby Workers Club. We enjoy a good rapport with our hosts, thanks largely to the efforts of Colleen and Bill Woods!

After all this, I can only come to one conclusion: Revesby Toastmasters is doing very well... and who can we thank for that? You, the members!

Look forward, with great delight, to another six months as your Club President.

RESPONSIBLE SERVICE OF GAMING POLICY

Policy Objectives

- To provide members and their guests a gambling environment which is both comfortable and safe.
- To ensure that members and their guests have access to problem gambling advice. The Club is a member of the Clubsafe programme for responsible gambling. Brochures are located in the Gaming areas as well as Reception.
- To minimise harm and maximise benefits to members, guests of members, visitors and the community through the provision of responsible service of gaming.
- To consider the impact gambling can have on different people in the community.
- To reflect both the Club's and the Club industry's commitment towards identifying any problems facing Club patrons and implementing strategies to assist in solving those problems.
- To require the Club to regularly review and monitor the content of the policy to ensure that it reflects the relevant legislation and regulations.
- To place obligations on the Board of Directors, Management and the Staff of Revesby Workers' Club to ensure that the objectives of the policy are addressed and upheld in accordance with community values in relation to gambling
- Clubsafe Exclusion registers are located in the Foyer, Change Box and Duty Managers' office and staff are requested to familiarise themselves with the contents each week and sign accordingly.

Principles of the House Policy

Responsible service of gaming is vital for legal, health and community reasons. These factors are recognised in a range of legislation and regulations, which Revesby Workers' Club is bound by.

These include:

- Registered Clubs Act 1976;
- Liquor Act 1982;
- Gaming Machines Act 2001;
- Fair Trading Act 1987;
- Trade Practices Act 1974;
- Lotteries and Art Unions Act 1901;
- Privacy Act 1988.

RESPONSIBLE SERVICE OF ALCOHOL POLICY

Revesby Workers' Club has adopted the following strategies for the Responsible Service of Alcohol:

- **Education of Patrons** so that they understand the implications of and abide by the responsible service of alcohol policy.
- **Prevention of under age drinking.**
- **Promoting safe transport options.**
