Re: Submission on General Practice compliance costs

Please accept this submission on compliance costs in General Practice. The attached excel spreadsheet quantifies the time taken to complete the forms as required by various government departments and is based on information gathered from discussions with GPs. The quantification is not an exhaustive list, but will provide a reasonable estimation of the number of hours required each year (212 hours in this case) to comply with government "red tape".

In this example, part of the administrative work is dealt with by nurses or administrative staff. Other GPs in a solo practice or small group practice are less likely to have such support and probably bear an even greater administrative burden.

EPC and care plans in particular also raise a number of other issues, as coordination of care with other people (eg. allied health staff) is required. These issues range from workload, timeframe and financial aspects on the other party.

Our concern is not so much lack of payment (of course it helps to be paid for it), but rather this time could be much better spent in patient care. With the growing shortage of GPs in metropolitan areas, the increasing administrative workload is placing more pressure on doctors in a health system that requires all of the available capacity of doctors to meet the clinical needs of patients. GPs need to get back to what they do best: treating patients, not administration.

We recommend a review of existing forms by a panel of GPs in terms of content and layout and to determine what could be completed by practice staff.
