Re- Submission to Native Vegetation Inquiry

Having been General Manager of the South Coast Rural Lands Protection Board for some

27 years I would like to make general comment on some aspects of the terms of reference

relative to the inquiry. My period of close association with rural land owners in the above

role covers the years from 1965 to my retirement in 1992.

Firstly, I would like to express my concern that over recent years the rights of land owners

and in particular the genuine farmer are being eroded through various government actions

spurred on by single issue minority groups under the pretence of protecting the environment.

Whilst I agree that the environment must be protected it seems to me that the pendulum has

swung too far leading to legitimate land owners becoming virtual tenants to the state for land

they legally own.

I fully believe that all Governments should assist in managing environmental issues on rural

land but only in an advisory capacity. In my opinion most land owners would co-operate

with governments and environmentalists should environmental safe guards be genuinely

required. However, this cooperation would only work if landowners are fairly compensated

for loss of production income as a consequence of recommended environmental control

measures. For those landowners who refuse to cooperate following fair hearings of their

case severe penalties should be forthcoming.

To me when farmers are directed or ordered by government bureaucrats as to what and how

much they should grow, how much water they can dam, where vegetation should be

removed from, where wildlife corridors are to be located and what areas of buffer zones

should be established on their land bordering national parks etc they have lost control of

their properties.

Surely the Australian Constitution must have in-built safe guards within it to protect the

rights of legal landowners from Governments exercising measures to undermine traditional

existing rights.

This submission is very brief and is in general terms but I feel that on such a matter that goes

to the very heart of our democracy I had to express an opinion.
