Retention rates can exceed 100 per cent for a variety of reasons, including student transfers between jurisdictions after the base year.

Ungraded students may have been graded at the year of commencement of secondary schooling and would have been included in the base year but not included in the current year. Apparent retention rates were higher than expected in Queensland because of a significant net gain in interstate migration compared with other states and territories.
