I feel the that the reasons citrus prices have been very poor over the past ten years are, lack of government support, high quantities of cheap Brazilian concentrate, picking costs, cost of production, 25% sales tax concession abolishment and the low tariffs the Australian government has put in place for Countries wanting to import into Australia.
