To whom it may concern.

I am writing in support of retaining the current MCH post graduate qualification.

I am ANNE DYNON, & have worked in mch for 30 years, mainly at Frankston City. I am a General Nurse (Merry Mills 1971-1973) a Midwife (Merry Maternity (1975-76) & has a Graduate Diploma in Community Health (m + ch) from Lincoln Institute (LaTrobe - 1983) I am an I.B.L.C. Graduate.

I am concerned with any attempt to change the post graduate qualifications as I see this as a "dumbing down" of a wonderful, 'free' community service' founded in Victoria and elsewhere in Australia.

The qualifications listed are crucial to midwifery practice. Midwifery knowledge is essential at the Home visit where the pregnancy + birth history are presented. Lactation advice, gynaecological advice, immunisation, SIDS-BSIs, family dynamics, are all part of the midwife brief. Maternal welfare is as important as welfare of the newborn, and experience in maternity services and midwifery services are essential.

Removing these 'disciplines', removes a critical body of knowledge + skills to practise as a midwife nurse.

I also support midwife postgraduate Scholarships as a way of attracting potential midwives to our service.

In Victoria we enjoy the best standards of midwifery in the country, & hope other states will follow Victoria's midwife lead.
