Productivity Commissions 2012, Australia's Export Credit Arrangements

There are some concerns regarding some of the recommendations outlined in the Productivity Commissions report on Export Credit Arrangement.

Our company is a division of an ASX listed company and as a division takes on projects internationally without the ability to leverage the resources of the larger group. We are effectively a small company growing rapidly and generating export opportunities that could not be approached without the support of EFIC.

We fall above the \$25m turnover and we have been exporting similar products for more than a few years. Regardless of this we are creating new export opportunities and growing Australia's ability to export. We request that the productivity commission not include any expansion of an annual turnover limitation and any restriction to new exporters only.

Each country we enter is a new market opportunity and in each market we have a need to secure financing for valid projects. Limiting the ability to utilize EFIC funding to 3 times would significantly hamper our ability to grow exports. We request that the productivity commission not include any limiting of funding for any specific number of instances.









EFIC provides funding that cannot otherwise be secured. It directly assists companies deliver exports and generate Australian profits. I believe EFIC has provided a valuable and proven capability to companies like Eco-kinetics and I believe it should be encouraged to maintain and improve its ability to deliver such products.
