FOREWARD

"COMMON INTEREST AND MUTUAL BENEFIT" These words are as relevant today as they were when Returned Services Clubs were first established some ninety years ago. The words, perpetually indelible in the Articles of Association of Clubs are the golden thread which weaves throughout the fabric of the Club Industry.

The Commission's Terms of Reference have been noted. It is true the compound effects of 'problem gaming' and the more serious 'severe problem gaming' (Dickerson methodology) are destructive to the individual, the family unit and the community.

Club Five Dock focuses vigilantly upon on harm minimization and irresponsible gaming prevention measures. (See Part VII of this submission). Our Club presently has 166 gaming machines and some 8994 members. It would be naïve to suggest there were no problem gamblers among the members. Nevertheless the Club Board is of the opinion such members would be in the extreme minority, if they exist at all.

As the Commission would be aware it has been widely reported at least one Registered Club in New South Wales either ceases to operate each week or alternatively seeks amalgamation. The ongoing effects of increased Gaming Machine taxation; non-smoking legislation and the global downturn in the Australian and World economy are all contributing factors. Other threats include the growth of internet gaming and Casino operations.

The accompanying submission has examined Club Five Dock's gaming and other activities for the period 1998-2008 inclusive. Gaming taxation in 1998 was 23.34% or \$1,521,035 of the \$6,516,161 revenue. Additionally Donations from Gaming Revenue was 0.84% or \$54,606. In the year ending this percentage in gaming taxation had risen to 28.14% or \$2,431,329 of \$8,639,562 of revenue whilst Donations increase to 2.25% or \$194,531 of the \$8,639,562 revenue. In effect a percentage increase from 24.18% to 30.39% or in dollar terms \$1,575,641 to \$2,625,860.

As with other Clubs, Club Five Dock cannot absorb any further incursions impacting upon Member's Funds. The Club is fortunate it has continued to deliver a quality product to its members over some sixty years. The loss suffered for the trading year ending 31st December, 2008 before income tax was \$182,268.

At Part VII of this submission the social, recreational, entertainment and other benefits provided to members are documented. Also documented is the socio-economic affect upon employment and commerce generated from the activities of Club Five Dock. These benefits generated by the Club movement generally should be given proper weight when comparison is made to the adverse affects of problem gaming.

It is submitted the Commission should give some balance when reporting its findings of the adverse affect on the local and wider community.

PART 1.

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE RETURNED SERVICES LEAGUE AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF FIVE DOCK RSL COMMUNITY CLUB LTD.

The Returned Services League of Australia was formed in 1916 when the first men were returning to Australia during the 1914-1918 Great War in which 59000 Australian soldiers made the supreme sacrifice. The need for some organisation to protect the interests of the men was recognized as they were suffering from appalling wounds, incapacities and sickness. Very little was being done to implement some form of repatriation and any assistance was very fragmented and inadequate.

The Returned men gathered in clubhouses and halls, most of which had been provided by public subscriptions, state and municipal authorities. Veterans soon realised to get any action on the promises honored, during which time politicians were very busy trumpeting patriotic slogans and clichés, which not cost anything, it would be necessary to form an association for the purpose of obtaining justice in their claims for pensions, medical attention (which was non existent) and rehabilitation.

Some small associations were in existence. They were very scattered with no political clout. The need for a strong consolidated organisation was agreed upon and resulted in a conference being held in Melbourne attended by delegates from all states. It was decided that a further conference should be held in Brisbane and this resulted in the formation of a Federal body with branches in all States.

The League established in the Federal sphere and in all states quickly proceeded to demonstrate to the Commonwealth Government that it was numerically the strongest and the only organisation that could adequately represent Returned Soldiers in representations to the Government. This was recognized and all Government departments were required to accept the R.S.L. as the official authority to speak on behalf of Returned Soldiers. This resulted in the co-ordination and representation to the Government for a fair deal in matters relating to pensions, medical attention, employment and rehabilitation. Strong and dedicated leadership by the R.S.L. forced the Hughes Government, supported by the Opposition, to pass the Repatriation Act in 1920, and thus came operation this famous and historical legislation which was an example to the world of how a grateful nation should treat its ex-service personnel, and their dependents, who had sacrificed so much for their country.

The Act which, from time to time has been amended, updated and adapted to meet the needs of our ageing ex-service personnel and dependants, and always under the vigilant eyes of the RSL which never neglected to protect the interests of its members and their dependants.

The Five Dock RSL Sub-Branch was formed in 1918 and in 1920 merged to become known as the Haberfield, Five Dock and Abbotsford RSL Sub-Branch. In 1956 the Sub-Branch revised its Constitution and successfully applied for a Registered Clubs License. On the 26th July, 1958 The official opening of the Haberfield-Five Dock-Abbotsford R.S.S. & A.L.L.A. Club premises at our current Club address of 66 Great North Road, Five Dock was conducted by the then Governor, Lieutenant General Eric Woodward.

In the early 60's Five Dock RSL Sub-Branch stood alone and was incorporated. In 1999 the Sub-Branch sold the premises to the Five Dock RSL Community Club. A Memorandum of Understanding was prepared wherein common agreement was reached on a number of conditions including the Sub-Branch would have office accommodation; the Ode would always be played each night; The Australian Flag would fly each day from the roof of the Club Premises and other recognition given to the Sub-Branch. The Board of Five Dock RSL Community Club Ltd enjoys a good working and social relationship with the Five Dock RSL Sub-Branch.

 Club Five Dock is situate within the Local Government Area of City of Canada Bay.

The following demographic statistics have been taken from the 2006 ABS:

- Canada Bay Council region is ranked 12th of 152 LGA's in terms of fastest and largest growth
- Total population 65,743
- Population by gender: 48% male and 52% female
- About 30% of the population speak a second language in addition to English including a significant Italian population in addition to Greek, Cantonese/Mandarin, Korean and Arabic. There is a steady increase in South East Asian residents
- 31.4% of the LGA population were born overseas
- Residents are categorised as high income earners
- Average mortgage is 25% greater than Sydney average
- Average house valued at \$870,000 compared to \$518,000 Sydney Metropolitan Area
- 53% of the residential population are employed
- There is a very low level of disadvantaged residents

b. DEMOGRAPHICS – Post Code 2046 – Five Dock

- 24,196 residents
- 47.4% male and 52.6% female
- 6,601 families are resident of which 43.1% were couples with children; 41.1% couples without children and 13.6% one parent families
- 15.9% of the population were under 14 years and 26.5% over 55 years. The median age was 38 years
- 84.7% are Australian citizens with 62.5% born in Australia.
- 29.4% born overseas including 6.1% Italian; 3.7% Great Britain, 3.4% China, 1.9% New Zealand, 1.4% Greece, 1.9% South Korea, 1.2% Hong Kong and 1% India
- English at 63.9% was the only language spoken at home whilst Italian at 14.6% spoken at home is significant
- 49.9% of residents were married; 33.2% never married; 10.9% separated or divorced and 6.65% widowed.





SOCIAL, RECREATON, ENTERTAINMENT AND OTHER BENEFITS TO MEMBERS OF CLUB FIVE DOCK.

1. GAMING

Gaming Machines.

Club Five Dock presently has 166 gaming machines.

Other Gaming includes Club Keno, TAB, Sportsbet, Raffles and Bingo.

RESPONSIBLE GAMING PRACTICES AT CLUB FIVE DOCK INCLUDE:

- All personnel must have completed the Responsible Conduct of Gaming and received the appropriate certificate prior to employment
- Regulatory signage is posted on all machines as to chances of winning and effects
 of problem gambling as well as counseling service information regarding
 problem gambling
- Self exclusion policies are in place
- Limits on cash payouts to \$2,000.
- Ethical guidelines are followed in respect of promotions related to the playing of machines
- The Club ATM has only a debit facility
- The Club ATM is located away from the gaming areas
- · Clocks are prominently displayed in and away from gaming area
- Responsible Gaming publications are displayed in the Club Foyer, including advice:- G-Line; 'Play smart' displaying the odds of winning at various gaming activities including Gaming Machines, TAB and Keno
- The Club policy on responsible gaming on all advertising
- Strict observation with marketing and advertising policies

Note: Club Five Dock has diversified its income stream through the building of residential, commercial and retail premises over three levels at 52 Great North Road. It is anticipated premises will produce a profit in 2011.

2. ENTERTAINMENT

Club Five Dock offers members and visitors a diverse range of Entertainment. These include, but are not restricted to:

FAMILY SUNDAY CABARET

Held last Sunday of each month - free entertainment featuring well known artists. It is a family focused afternoon and is proving popular with members.

VEGAS DAY

A festive line-up of fun and entertainment each Tuesday from 10.30am onwards. Includes: a free raffle with prizes totaling \$300 comprised Meat and Grocery trays, lucky door prizes, \$5 Club Vouchers as trivia prizes with total value of \$200, two Guests artists at 11.00am and 1.00pm and a \$5 lunch special.

This is a very popular morning and afternoon attracting a significant number of our more senior members and guests particularly ladies. It is seen as a weekly opportunity for friends to socialise, enjoy quality entertainment and lunch at a modest cost for a day out.

Apart from its popularity with local members Vegas Day is attended by residents from retirement villages and nursing homes.

Club Five Dock is quite proud of this entertainment offered to its members, particularly with the immense enjoyment had by pensioners and retirees.

SHOWTIME

Live entertainment provided each Friday and Saturday nights from 8.00pm till late. Showtime features quality artists catering to a wide variety of musical tastes.

ENTERTAINMENT FOR THE YOUNG

Special entertainment is provided for children at Easter, Halloween, School Holidays and Christmas. In addition The Jitterbugs appear on the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month at a subsided charge of \$5. These shows are very popular with the children and their parents, bookings are essential.

SPECIAL DAYS

Promotions and/or entertainment is provided on special days during the year including ANZAC Day, Valentines Day, Mothers' Day, Melbourne Cup etc.

Cost of entertainment totaled over \$198k for year ending 2008.

3. PROMOTIONS

MAJOR PROMOTIONS

At the time of writing three such promotions are being conducted: 'Grand Friday' featuring \$1,000 cash prizes each Friday over 52 weeks, 'Super Tuesday' wherein members can win a variety of whitegoods and 'Sign your own Cheque'. Entry is generated through utilising the Clubs beverage, catering and gaming facilities. The Sign your own cheque promotion is by way of random mail out.

WEEKLY PROMOTIONS

These include: meal subsidies, members free raffles, subsidised meat and seafood raffles on Tuesday, Friday and Sundays, loyalty bonus points whereby members utilise their membership card within the Club to earn points which can be redeemed for club vouchers in various denominations which are accepted for goods and services within the Club (excluding gaming) and are also accepted at thirty business premises within Five Dock and surrounds. These businesses range from hairdressers, travel agents, butchers, service stations, chemists, delicatessens, restaurants, electrical retailers and many more.

Other promotions include: birthday vouchers, major members card draw, major Christmas and Easter raffles, bingo, talent quests etc.

Cost of promotions during the 2008 financial over \$621k.

4. THREE PEPPERS BISTRO

Club Five Dock operates its own catering operation the popular 'Three Peppers Bistro'. The menu includes traditional Australian meals and a range of more exotic fare. A full Asian menu is also available.

Special subsidies apply and include Vegas Day \$5 meals, Free Meals for children each Monday, \$10 Pasta nights, \$10 steak nights, \$10 Burger nights, \$10 Sunday Roast and \$10 rump nights.

The operating loss of the Three Peppers Bistro during the 2008 financial over \$144k.

5. THE DOCKERS SPORTS BAR

Several facilities are located on the basement level of the Club Premises. These include a large TAB area with large plasma screens and multiple information screens and a large general sports viewing area.

These screens permit the simultaneous viewing of three pay television sports events as well as race meetings.

The Docker Sports bar is very popular with football enthusiasts of all codes at local and international level. It is widely noted for its extensive coverage of boxing events. The snooker and pool room is regarded as one of the best in the Inner West area of Sydney.
