Centre day care	Respite care provided from a facility such as a day care or health centre. Respite care was usually combined with social support services to maintain the functional capabilities of the person receiving care
Community Options Projects	Case management for people with complex care needs — for example, managing or purchasing a package of care services
Complaint	A query or grievance that any member of the public made to the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care about any services provided by a Commonwealth funded nursing home, hostel or Community Aged Care Package
Handicap	A limitation in performing certain tasks associated with daily living. The limitation had to result from a disability and affect one or more of the following areas: self care; mobility; verbal communication; schooling; or employment
Home help	Assistance to undertake household tasks (for example, washing clothes)
Home maintenance / modification	Assistance in undertaking home maintenance tasks which a person was unable to undertake themselves, or modification of the home for care purposes (for example, installing hand rails)
Home meals / centre meals	Meals provided to persons either in their own home or at a separate facility. Included 'meals on wheels'
Home nursing	Nursing care provided in a person's home (for example, assistance with taking medication)
Home respite	A short term substitute for usual care. In-home respite could be provided in either the home of the person requiring or providing care, and could be for up to a day, overnight or longer periods
Hostel	Residential facilities for older people which provided accommodation, personal care and occasional or limited nursing services
Nursing home	Residential facilities for frail older people which provided accommodation, 24 hour nursing care and personal care
Paramedical services	Services to help people maintain their independence and mobility — for example, physiotherapy, podiatry, speech therapy and occupational therapy
People from non-English speaking backgrounds	People whose first spoken language was not English
People with a moderate handicap	Those people with a disability who did not require help or supervision with tasks relevant to self care, mobility and verbal communication but who had difficulty performing one or more of these tasks
People with a profound handicap	Those people with a disability who always required help or supervision in one or more of self care, mobility and verbal communication
People with a severe handicap	Those people with a disability who sometimes required help or supervision with tasks relevant to self care, mobility and verbal communication
Personal care	Assistance to undertake personal tasks (for example, bathing)
Real expenditure	Actual expenditure adjusted for changes in prices, using the GDP(E) price deflator, and expressed in terms of final year prices
Respite care	Alternative care arrangements for dependent people living in the community, with the primary purpose of giving their carer a short term break from their usual caring commitments
