HOUSING (CHAPTER 16)

This chapter focuses on the performance of governments in providing social housing, including public housing, State owned and managed Indigenous housing (SOMIH), community housing and Indigenous community housing, under the National Affordable Housing Agreement (NAHA).

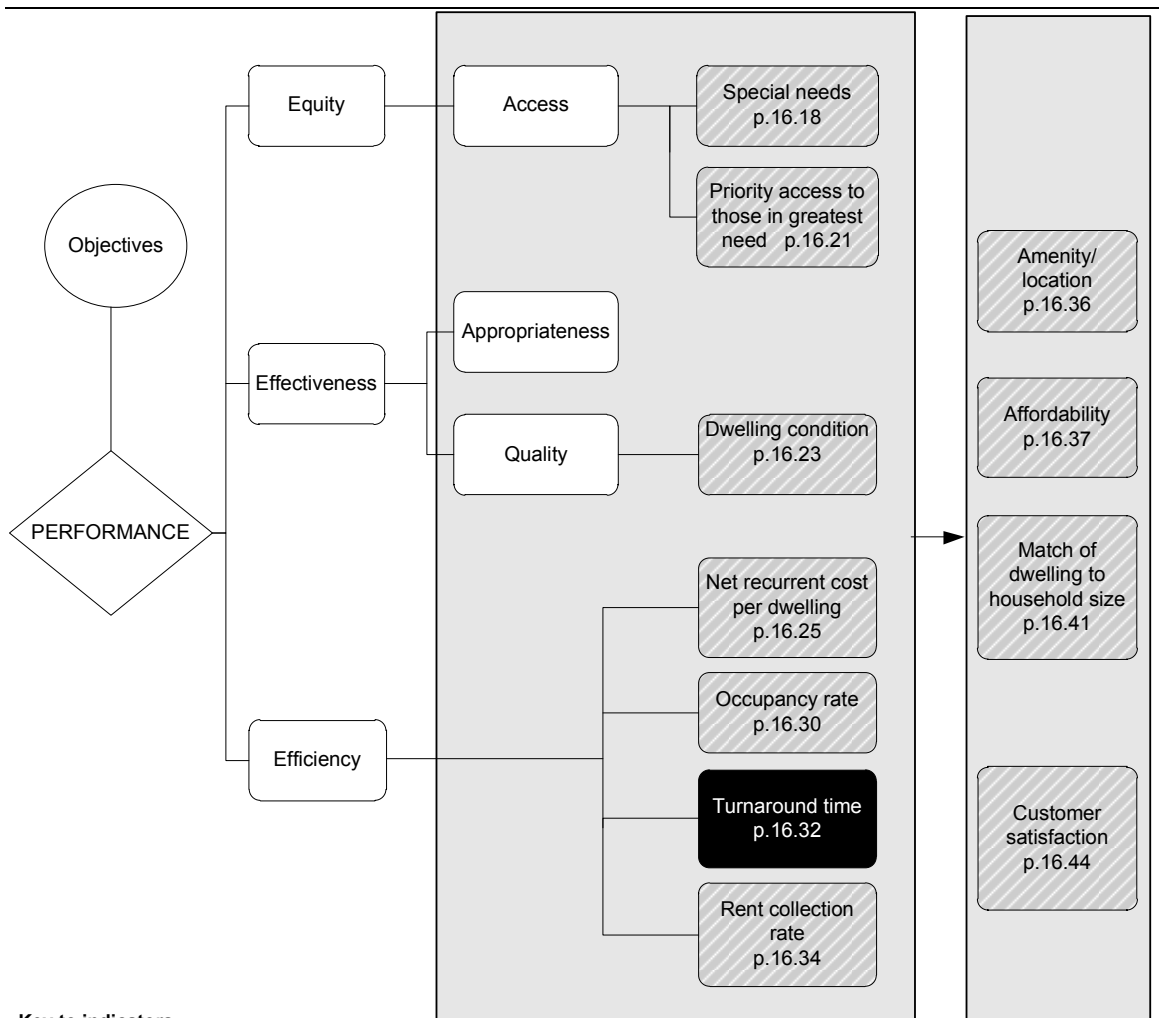
- Nationally at 30 June 2011, there were 330 987 public housing dwellings, of which 324 583 were occupied and 9820 SOMIH dwellings, of which 9564 were occupied **(p.16.7)**. A further 54 911 households were assisted with community housing and there were 59 777 community housing tenancy rental units in Australia **(p.16.10)**.
- There were 18 695 permanent dwellings managed by Indigenous community housing organisations at 30 June 2010 **(table 16A.3)**.

Objectives for social housing

Social housing aims to assist people unable to access alternative suitable housing options through the delivery of affordable, appropriate, flexible and diverse social housing. Some forms of social housing aim specifically to contribute to Indigenous community wellbeing by improving housing outcomes for Indigenous people, especially those living in remote communities **(p. 16.16)**.
