## **QUEENSLAND – Report against Subacute Care Implementation Plan**

July – December 2009

## Summary of Progress

Queensland has committed the majority of the NPA funding to deliver an additional 89 rehabilitation beds across the state and therefore complement the already planned increase in bed numbers over the four year period.

This commitment reflects the priority areas of the Queensland Health Strategic Plan 2007–12 and the Queensland Statewide Health Services Plan 2007-2012.

The additional places will be provided in three sites: 15 rehabilitation places at Rockhampton Hospital, 44 additional rehabilitation beds in Sandgate Brisbane and 30 rehabilitation or step down beds at Parklands in Townsville.

\$96.1 million has been allocated over the four year period.

Queensland is also expanding the provision of the Online Geriatric Assessment Service to the 20 major Queensland Health Hospitals. \$1.1 million has been allocated over the four year period.
